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## LISBON REGIONAL SCHOOL K-12

Lisbon, NH



Lisbon Regional School is a K-12 competency based education school serving the towns of Lisbon, Lyman, Landaff and Bath. Offering an educational experience from Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, Lisbon houses three schools (elementary, middle and high school) within one building. Lisbon has a low teacher to student ratio and small class sizes to allow students to receive a personalized education. At the high school level Lisbon offers dual enrollment courses for students to earn both high school and college credit and over 85% of our students pursue four-year colleges. In addition to our comprehensive curriculum, students have access to over 1,000 online courses from Music Composition to Advanced Placement (AP) classes. High school juniors and seniors also have the opportunity to participate in internships and attend Career Technical Education (CTE) classes. Students in grades 9 to 12 receive a school issued laptop. Lisbon is a NHIAA Division IV school offering soccer, basketball and softball/baseball. We have numerous extra-curricular clubs including Gamesters, Academic Team and PAWS (Panther Adventure Wilderness Society). Lisbon Regional School employs a full time professional staff of 65 with a supplemental part-time staff of 20. Over sixty percent of the staff hold a master's degree or higher. Total enrollment K-12 is approximately 340 with an average graduating class size of 25.

## Elementary School Information

The elementary students at Lisbon Regional School work to master competencies important at each grade level. As part of that work, they participate in a variety of activities. Field trips include travel to many different locations, including a three day and two night trip at the 5th/6th grade level to Nature's Classroom on an every other year rotation.

Students participate in plays, research and present projects, and assist in community activities. Students in K-6 participate in art class once a week throughout the year, creating both 2D and 3D art work. Kindergarten through sixth grade students participate in Project Lead the Way. They are also involved in statewide reading programs called Lady Bug at the K-3 Level and Great Stone Face in grades 3-6. There are musical concerts involving all of the elementary students as well as instrumental programs for the students in grades 4-6.

Elementary school students participate in monthly community meetings to celebrate student achievements and share classroom activities. At the end of the year, the K-2 classes hold a showcase to highlight work and there is a final assembly for grades 3-6 to recognize accomplishments.

## Middle School Information

The Middle School experience at Lisbon provides an opportunity for students to explore a variety of subject areas and participate in organizations designed specifically for them. The Middle School also offers monthly positive reward activities for students who earn "paws" in recognition of excellence in various areas. Activities include hiking, swimming, rock climbing, and gaming to name a few.

**Subject areas students are able to explore include:** technology, band, chorus, art, physical education, health, family and consumer sciences, engineering, and world languages.

### **Middle School Organizations/Groups include:**

**Athletics:** Students may participate in soccer, basketball, baseball, and softball.

**Student Council:** Students work to organize and plan middle school dances, a winter carnival, and an annual trip to the movies. They also sponsor a yearly food drive and book swap.

**Film Festival:** Students are given the opportunity to participate in the North Country Middle School Film Festival in the spring. Through technology class, students learn about the movie making process, write, and produce a movie for the festival.

**National Junior Honor Society:** Students who excel in their academics are encouraged to join this organization in eighth grade. Students participate in many community service activities such as the Dinner Bell in Littleton, The Longest Night in Franconia, and running the Lisbon Regional School elementary field day.

**Leadership Team:** The Lisbon Middle School Youth Leadership Through Adventure (YLTA) Team is a student led, adult supported group which promotes community and inclusiveness through place-based service learning projects, empowering youth to provide leadership and self-governance.

## High School Information

A full range of courses is offered in English, Social Studies, Science, Mathematics, Business Technology and the Arts. A three-year sequence of Spanish is also offered.

The Lisbon Regional School teaching staff also offers many exciting classes for college credit through Running Start. Courses for college credit include College Composition, Senior American Literature, Physics, AP Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy & Physiology, Pre-Calculus, Calculus and Statistics. Soon we will be offering students the opportunity to earn an associate's degree from White Mountain Community College. Lisbon is a New Hampshire Scholars and Gear Up NH school.

### High School Academic Requirements

In order to qualify for a Lisbon Regional High School diploma, each graduate shall successfully complete at least twenty-seven and one quarter credits selected from the school's program of studies and complete all Performance-Based requirements. Required credits are as follows for all students:
